Do you have limited access to funding?

**Priorities/details:** If so the Community Foundation for Greater Manchester has a new fund available. The Seed Fund is a sum of money available to groups or individuals who want to help others but don't have the financial support to do so.

**Grant amount:** The maximum grant request that will be considered is £1,000,

**Deadline:** 27 January 2010.

### Grassroots Grants – Last Chance to Apply!

**Priorities/details:** The Community Foundation is encouraging groups to plan ahead for 2010 and apply for a Grassroots Grant as soon as possible. The fund is entering its final year will stop awarding grant money in September 2010.

**Who for?** Grants can be used to fund a wide range of activities such as: purchasing equipment; putting on a local event; contribution to rent costs and the training of volunteers.

**Grant amount:** £100,000 is available for groups in Tameside. Awards of up to £5,000 are available.

### Trusthouse Charitable Foundation

**Priorities/details: Two issues**

**Rural:** They are interested in, for example, projects providing transport for the elderly, disabled or disadvantaged; contact networks for young disabled people; projects which encourage a sense of community such as community centres and village halls; employment training schemes especially those

promoting local, traditional crafts; projects addressing issues such as drug/alcohol misuse or homelessness.

**Urban deprivation:** They are interested in, for example, youth clubs; training schemes to help people out of unemployment; drop in centres for the homeless that are in the top 20% of the Multiple index of *deprivation*.

**Who for?** National or local charities.

**Grant amount:** They have three schemes: Large Grants Scheme for applications between £10,000 and £30,000; Small Grants Scheme for applications between £5,001 and £9,999; Fast Track Scheme for applications of £5,000 and below.

**Application process:** All applicants must complete an application form available online.

**Priorities/details:** To be successful a group must:

carry out positive work in the community and a project must: address a community issue, provide a good long-term benefit to the community, support co-operative values and principles, ideally be innovative in its approach.

**Who for?** Community, voluntary or self help groups.

**Grant amount:** £100 - £2000.

**Application process:** Apply online.

### Bernard Sunley Charitable Foundation

**Priorities/details:** Funding is for a wide cross section of the community, including: education, arts, religion, community, children and youth, elderly, health, social welfare, environment, animal welfare, amateur sport, emergency and armed services, and overseas.

**Grant amount:** Grants range in size from £250,000 down to less than £1,000, although most grants will be for less than £10,000.

**Application process:** Write to the Director giving details of your charity and its objectives, the need and purpose of your project and how much it will cost, the size of grant requested, how much has already been raised and from whom, and how you plan to raise the shortfall. Include annual report and accounts and any other documentation you feel will help to support your appeal.

**Deadlines:** No deadlines.

## J PAUL GETTY JNR CHARITABLE TRUST **J Paul Getty Jr. Charitable Trust - Guidelines updated**

**Priorities/details: Reducing Reoffending:** projects aiming to improve the lot of people in prison and smooth the transition for those leaving prison, maximising their chances of successful resettlement.

**Improving Prospects:** projects providing meaningful occupation for young people aged 14-19 to improve their employability and diminish the risk of social exclusion; work to improve the treatment of refugees and asylum seekers.

**Repairing Communities:** projects led from within the community with the aim of integrating different social and ethnic groups in pursuit of worthwhile goals.

**Repairing Lives:** projects making a lasting impact on the lives of people with substance misuse problems; projects helping people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness.

**Preserving Heritage:** conserving or restoring buildings and landscapes which are of national value and accessible to the public; saving from export art and manuscripts of national importance; developing conservation skills, especially among disadvantaged groups.

**Sustaining the Arts:** nurturing and developing artistic endeavour of the highest quality.

**Who for?** Registered charities.

**Grant amount:** Main grants are between £10,000 and £250,000 over a period of one to three years. Small grants of up to £5,000.

**Application process:** Online application only.

**Deadlines:** No deadlines.

## **The Yapp Charitable Trust**

**Priorities/details:** The Yapp Charitable Trust make grants to small registered charities to sustain their existing work with: elderly people, children and young people aged 5 – 25, people with disabilities or mental health problems, people trying to overcome life-limiting problems of a social, rather than medical, origin - such as addiction, relationship difficulties, abuse, a history of offending

**Who for?** Small registered charities.

**Grant amount:** They give grants for running costs and salaries for up to three years. Grants are normally for a maximum of £3,000 per year

**Application process:** Please use their eligibility checker online before applying. Further help and their application form are online.

## OTS Hardship Fund - Community Development Foundation

**Priorities/details:** The Hardship Fund will provide grant support to third sector organisations in England delivering front-line services to the most vulnerable and disadvantaged people in society that have been affected by the recession.

**Who for?** Health and social care, housing support, education and training, information, advice and guidance.

**Grant amount:** Grants of between £50,000 and £250,000.

**Application process:** Guidance notes and application form available online.

**Deadlines:** Because this Fund is to support Third Sector organisations facing financial hardship, they will assess applications in the date and time order that they receive them at CDF (on a rolling programme) until there are sufficient relevant applications up to the value of the Fund.

**Priorities/details:** This scheme is for individuals, arts organisations and other people who use the arts in their work. Grants are for activities over

a set period which engage people in England in the arts, and help artists and arts organisations in England carry out their work.

**Who for?** Individuals and groups.

**Grant amount:** Individuals £1000 - £30000 and groups £1000 to £100000

**Application process:** Apply online.

## SPORT

### Community Foundation Network - Comic Relief

**Priorities/details:**

- Increase access to sport and exercise for people who face social exclusion and isolation.
- Help people who are experiencing difficulties in their lives to regain their confidence and self-esteem.
- Build skills of local people, Increase community cohesion, Respond to local economic needs.

### Church Urban Fund - Mustard Seed Programme

**Priorities/details:** The Mustard Seed Grant Programme aims to 'Provide grants to enable churches and faith-based organisations to engage in social action through supporting them to initiate or develop community work.'

**Who for?** Any church or faith-based group can apply.

**Grant amount:** Grant requests up to £5,000 will be considered.

**Application process:** All applications must be submitted to the respective Link Officer in the first instance (NOT to Church Urban Fund Head Office). A list of all the Link Officers can be found on the Church Urban Fund website.

and find innovative ways to raise awareness about the effects of alcohol, to help reduce alcohol misuse and minimise alcohol-related harm.

**Who for?** Grants are available to groups in any part of the UK, working with any population group.

**Grant amount:** Ideas Fund - up to £2,000, Awareness Projects - up to £25,000, Big Impact Awards - up to £100,000.

**Application process:** Applications available online.

## BUILDINGS

### English Heritage - Historic Buildings, Monuments and Designed Landscapes



ENGLISH HERITAGE

**Priorities/details:** This scheme covers grants for the repair and conservation of some of England's most significant historic buildings, monuments and designed landscapes. Grants are primarily offered for urgent repairs or other work required within two years to prevent loss or damage to important architectural, archaeological or landscape features.

**Who for?** Buildings listed at grade I or II\*; a scheduled monument; a designed landscape that is included in their Register of Parks and Gardens at grade I or II\*.

**Grant amount:** They do not usually offer grants for projects costing less than £10,000 in total (including fees and VAT).

**Application process:** Application form.

**Deadlines:** If you are seeking a grant of £200,000 or more you are strongly advised to contact your regional office at an early stage. If you are requesting a grant of £200,000 or more they will normally need to have received your application by 31 January if it is to be considered for the following financial year.
